Welcome to the Osbournby Parish Council newsletter. Due to the pandemic there has not been a newsletter for some while, but I am sure you will all agree that while we were in lockdown the village was a happy place to be.

**VILLAGE SKIP**: Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> November 8.30a.m. till 11.00 a.m. Once again the Parish Council will be providing a skip in the High Street for villagers to get rid of their unwanted rubbish. Please note that this is for **domestic waste** and **Osbournby** residents only. Loads will be limited to cars, small vans and small trailers. The skip will be manned to help anyone needing assistance. Unfortunately the following will not be accepted:Asbestos, tyres, fridges, microwaves, gas cylinders and paint tins. (This is in compliance with Waste Management Regulations).

**COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH:** The CSW is a scheme designed to allow trained volunteers to address speed concerns in our community. Over the 9 months it was running before the pandemic we recorded 199 vehicles speeding through our village with a top speed of 54 mph. We are looking for volunteers, you must be over 18 and full training will be given.
