



63.	<p>District Council Report: Cllr Cook informed the meeting that there are a couple of consultations at NKDC at the moment and advised that these can be found on the NKDC website if people wish to comment. They relate to the Craft and Design Centre and the NKDC plan.</p> <p>Christmas bin collection dates are now also available on the website. Mrs King advised that notices are now being displayed giving dates.</p> <p>The Cluster meeting regarding the speed community watch had been successful and there is concern about the speed of vehicles using Mareham Lane. However many councillors and clerks in other villages in the Osbournby Ward have now left and there are a great many vacancies. Cllr Cook asked if anybody knew of any residents who may be interested to encourage them to get involved as a councillor.</p> <p>Cllr Hagues reported the the Ministry of Transport have awarded a further £13.7 million for additional cost of road repairs and Lincolnshire has received the highest amount.</p> <p>£50 million has been earmarked for education needs for children with special needs. Cllr Hagues advised that money received from the Government for education is ringfenced and can only be used for education so going to invest the money for building facilities for children with special needs.</p> <p>£300,000 has been received for additional ambulance in Lincolnshire area and it is hoped to be in place by Christmas.</p>	
64.	<p>Planning Matters: Plans for a bungalow to be built on the grounds of Sycamore Farm had been received with no objections from the Parish Council. However Cllr Baker had raised concerns about parking and advised that North Street is becoming very busy and lorries are churning up the grass verge as there is not room for them to pass.</p> <p>Mrs King advised that the temporary planning permission for the Van Der Windt building on The Drove expires on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2019. However Cllr Wright advised the meeting that he has been told that they will be moving to Swinderby soon, he was not aware of the date of the move.</p>	
65.	<p>Digital Hub Update: As Cllr Jackson not available, Mrs King advised the meeting that NKDC had paid the £1,000 grant to the Parish Council for the Digital Hub. This meant that to date the Parish Council had contributed £329.77 towards its running. It is still proving to be successful and once again Cllr Jackson was thanked for his hard work in this project.</p>
